

SPELLING AND GRAMMAR

Focused SPaG Lessons Phonics lessons and support for spelling

It is important to support your child. Be aware of what rule/ words they are learning so you can point out the spelling patterns when you hear them read. Learning the rule for spelling rather than simply the word allows the children to apply it to a wide range of words. READ, SAY, COVER, WRITE, CHECK

READING

Sentence Level Work (Grammar and Punctuation)

answering questions (repeating verbs in the positive or negative) the importance of word order in sentences checking sentences for accuracy and meaning capital letters and full-stops and other punctuation in sentences exploring past and present tenses

Text Level Work

developing an understanding of a range of texts – fiction, non-fiction and poetry Aspects of texts –cover, contents, author etc.

READING

Read every night with your child.

Ensure you are asking good comprehension questions.

Even when your child can comfortably read all the words on the page, there may be gaps in their understanding of the text. Ask questions about the story to ensure they understand.

WRITING

writing simple sentences

sequence a series of pictures, writing about the pictures to create a narrative or recount

writing labels and invitations

write a simple recount based on own experiences

explore writing through various genres





Read, write and order whole numbers up to 20 (Rang 2) Read, write and order whole numbers up to 50 (Rang 3) Explore addition and subtraction Explore the relationship between addition and subtraction Explore patterns on the 100 Square Odd and even numbers Mathematical investigations and problem-solving, including word problems (one step) Explore fractions, half and quarter

Measures Practical activities to explore and compare length, weight and capacity Measuring using non-standard measures

Money

Recognise and use 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p and 20p coins, up to \pounds 1, including work on the change received or given during shopping activities

<u>Time</u>

Understand the important times of the day Understand important dates of the year Begin to tell the time, beginning with o'clock and half past

Counting up and down the stairs. Number rhymes. Setting the table – cutlery, mats etc. Pair socks when getting in washing. Counting cars on the way to school. Spotting different numbers in the environment – door numbers, car number plates. Out shopping – making totals, finding change, Time – plan days out, what time to leave, how much money to take. Cooking – weighing ingredients, reading scales, adapting recipes. Keeping score in games.
